**DECLARATION OF RACHEL CHRISTMAN
RE: CLAIMS ADMINISTRATION**

I, **RACHEL CHRISTMAN**, declare:

1. I am a Senior Project Manager at Kurtzman Carson Consultants LLC (“KCC”). My business address is 3301 Kerner Boulevard, San Rafael, CA 94901. I am over 21 years of age and am not a party to this action. I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth herein and, if called as a witness, could and would testify competently thereto.

2. KCC was appointed by the Court to serve as the Claims Administrator to, among other tasks, a) mail the Notice of Proposed Class Action Settlement (the “Notice”), b) publish the Summary Notice in the appointed newspapers, c) provide toll-free call support to the Class Members; d) respond to Class Member inquiries; e) establish and maintain a settlement website; e) process and evaluate Claim Forms submitted by Class Members for eligibility, f) facilitate payments by check to approved claimants; and f) perform other duties as specified in the Settlement Agreement preliminarily approved by this Court on December 18, 2018.

3. **Mailed Notice**. On January 22, 2019, KCC mailed the Postcard Notice (collectively, the “Mailed Notice”) to each of the 13,424 persons or entities on the known Class Member List identified. The Postcard Notice directed known Class Members to the website for additional information and to file claim forms. Attached as Exhibit 1 is a copy of the mailed notice.

4. As of March 15, 2019, KCC has received 2,027 Notices that were returned by the United

1 States Postal Service as undeliverable that did not contain forwarding addresses. KCC performed
2 address searches for these Notices and was able to find updated addresses for 666 Notices that were
3 returned as undeliverable.

4 5. **Published Notice.** KCC caused the summary notice to appear as an eighth page ad unit
5 once in each of the newspapers and on the dates and pages listed on the attached Exhibit 2. The
6 published notice had a total circulation of 316,971. Attached as Exhibit 3 is a copy of the Summary
7 Notice as it appeared in each newspaper.

8 6. On February 1, 2019, KCC caused a press release to be issued throughout the states of
9 Oklahoma and Kansas. The press release was read and reported on by media outlets 153 times and
10 reached a potential audience of 10,500,000. Attached as Exhibit 4 is the copy of the press release as
11 posted on PR Newswire.

12 7. **Toll-Free Telephone Number.** On or before January 22, 2019, KCC established a toll-
13 free telephone number, (844) 833-3816 dedicated to answering telephone inquiries from Class Members,
14 providing copies of the long-form Notice and Claim Form upon request. Attached as Exhibit 5 is a copy
15 of the Long Form Notice and Claim Form mailed in response to these requests. As of March 15, 2019,
16 KCC has received 475 calls to the toll-free number.

17 8. **Website.** On or before January 22, 2019, KCC also established a website
18 (www.anadarkosettlement.com) dedicated to this settlement to provide additional information to the
19 Class Members and to answer frequently asked questions. Visitors of the website can download copies
20 of, among other documents, the Notice, the Claim Form the Settlement Agreement, and the Preliminary
21 Approval Order. The web site also contains contact information for KCC by Post Office Box, e-mail
22 address and the toll-free number as listed in paragraph 6 above. The website also allows known and
23 potential Class Members to file claims electronically. To the extent additional data about the lessor and
24 known acreage was known and provided to KCC, Class Members can authenticate their identity using
25 codes provided on the Postcard Notice, update their address, agree with or dispute the data available to
26 them, and submit their claim. To the extent additional data was not provided, potential Class Members
27 can provide their name, contact information, acreage information and upload documentation to the site
28 substantiating their claim. As of March 15, 2019, the website has registered 32,285 total hits.

There is a Settlement with Chesapeake Energy Corp., Chesapeake Exploration, L.L.C., and Tom L. Ward, and their affiliates (collectively, "Chesapeake") in a class action lawsuit about price-fixing and setting low bonus prices paid to landowners in exchange for the right to explore for and produce minerals on the land. BRIDGE by PHILLIP ALDER

THE MOST IMPORTANT HOLIDAY QUESTIONS

For two days, here are the answers to my Christmas Competition.

1. How should South play in six diamonds after West leads the club king?

This deal is based on one composed by Paul Lukacs from Israel, who died in 1982.

You must avoid losing two trump tricks. The textbook play is to cash the king, then to lead the three, planning to cover East's card as cheaply as possible. But with this layout, you go down. Whether you duck the second trump or win and return a diamond toward the dummy, West wins with his queen and leads the club queen to force the dummy to ruff. Then West gets a second trump trick.

Instead, cash the diamond king, cross to hand in a major and lead a low trump toward the board. Assuming West takes the trick and plays a high club, you ruff with the diamond nine, cash the diamond jack, cross to hand in the other major, take the diamond ace, which draws West's last trump, and claim because dummy is high.

I accepted anything reasonable. In this auction, two clubs is New Minor Forcing. Three diamonds shows primary support and at least game-forcing values. (North knows that South must have a four- or five-card diamond suit when he does not raise hearts on round two.) Now South has an awkward call. If he is afraid that partner will think a three-spade bid indicates a 4=3=4=2 hand, he might choose three no-trump. Then the auction might continue: four diamonds - five clubs (control-bid) - six diamonds - pass.

If You Leased an Oil & Gas Leasehold or Working Interest in Oklahoma or Kansas Between December 27, 2007 and April 1, 2013, You May Be Eligible for a Payment from a \$6.95 Million Settlement

There is a Settlement with Chesapeake Energy Corp., Chesapeake Exploration, L.L.C., Tom L. Ward, and their affiliates (collectively, "Chesapeake") in a class action lawsuit about price-fixing and setting low bonus prices paid to landowners in exchange for the right to explore for and produce minerals on the land. The lawsuit claims that Chesapeake and SandRidge Energy, Inc. and SandRidge Exploration and Production, L.L.C. ("SandRidge") unlawfully conspired to fix, raise, maintain or stabilize lease bonuses in the Mississippi Lime Play of the Anadarko Basin Region, to reduce bonus payments to the landowners.

The litigation claims that Chesapeake and SandRidge conspired to fix or set low bonus prices paid to the landowners in exchange for the chance to lease the leasehold or working interests. Instead of competing against each other to offer the landowners the highest bid or bonus price for leasing the land, Chesapeake and SandRidge conspired to provide a low bonus to the landowners. As a result, the landowners did not receive as high of a bonus payment for leasing their minerals to Chesapeake and SandRidge as they should have received. Chesapeake and SandRidge deny these claims and maintain they did nothing wrong. Plaintiffs in this lawsuit have brought an antitrust claim under the Sherman Act against Defendants.

front desk who told him what happened while he pulled up the security footage. The man told Hess that a truck a little smaller than a semi-trailer rig came through the canopy, hitting the top and knocking down a light and leaving scrapes on the top.

Officer Steven Nelson also responded to the scene to get a description of the truck and begin looking for it while Hess talked to the receptionist.

Hess took pictures of the damage and then followed the caller into the motel to see the security footage. When the two men found out that the cameras needed to load the video, the officer gave his phone number to have the man call when it was ready.

Once Hess got back into the police truck, he said he would drive down to Budget Inn to see if the truck had taken refuge at another hotel. He said he thought there was a small chance of the truck staying in Colby.

After looking at the Budget Inn and not finding anything, Hess drove down to the Country Club Motel, again finding nothing. Around this time, he got a

message over the radio from Nelson saying that he had found a white box truck in the Village Inn parking lot.

Stephens told him that he looked over the truck but did not see any damage. After this, Hess got a call back from the receptionist saying that the footage was ready to look at.

At Quality Inn again, the officer looked at the video, but could not make out the license plate number. The truck had lettering on the side doors, which couldn't be read on the video either.

Hess left Quality Inn without much information, but decided to take a look at the gas station by the Hampton Inn. Finally, Hess drove through the Comfort Inn parking lot and Village Inn to check out the truck Nelson had mentioned before.

Looking over the truck, he saw some minor damage to the top left side and after seeing a small piece of splintered wood on the back, Hess went into the Comfort Inn to ask if someone had checked in around 9:30 p.m.

The officer looked at the check-in times and went up to knock on the door of someone who checked in at the correct

time and asked if he had parked his truck outside. Knocking on the door led to no answer so he decided to go down to City Limits to check who was eating and if it matched the name of the man in the empty hotel room.

Again, no solution came when asking for the man who drove the white truck. Walking out of the eatery, a man came running up asking if Hess was looking for him. When asked, the man explained that he did not know he hit the canopy at Quality Inn.

The reason he left the scene of the accident, he said, was because he saw the construction and just wanted a quiet place to sleep. Hess took down all his information and took pictures of the truck.

“So it's kind of one of those tough calls,” he said. “Maybe he knew he hit it; it was pretty minor damage. I got to go with what I can prove, and he did have a reason to not stop there because of, like he said, they are under construction.”

All that was left to do, Hess said, was to gather up the paperwork and let Quality Inn know that he found the person and vehicle responsible.

Legal Notice

If You Leased an Oil & Gas Leasehold or Working Interest in Oklahoma or Kansas Between December 27, 2007 and April 1, 2013, You May Be Eligible for a Payment from a \$6.95 Million Settlement

There is a Settlement with Chesapeake Energy Corp., Chesapeake Exploration, L.L.C., Tom L. Ward, and their affiliates (collectively, “Chesapeake”) in a class action lawsuit about price-fixing and setting low bonus prices paid to landowners in exchange for the right to explore for and produce minerals on the land. The lawsuit claims that Chesapeake and SandRidge Energy, Inc. and SandRidge Exploration and Production, L.L.C. (“SandRidge”) unlawfully conspired to fix, raise, maintain or stabilize lease bonuses in the Mississippi Lime Play of the Anadarko Basin Region, to reduce bonus payments to the landowners.

The litigation claims that Chesapeake and Sandridge conspired to fix or set low bonus prices paid to the landowners in exchange for the chance to lease the leasehold or working interests. Instead of competing against each other to offer the landowners the highest bid or bonus price for leasing the land, Chesapeake and SandRidge conspired to provide a low bonus to the landowners. As a result, the landowners did not receive as high of a bonus payment for leasing their minerals to Chesapeake and SandRidge as they should have received. Chesapeake and SandRidge deny these claims and maintain they did nothing wrong. Plaintiffs in this lawsuit have brought an antitrust claim under the Sherman Act against Defendants.

Am I included?

You are included in the Settlement if you (individual or entity):

- Owned land within the Mississippi Lime Play (see below for definition);
- And at any time between December 27, 2007 and April 1, 2013;
- You signed a lease with Chesapeake or SandRidge (or their affiliates or agents, such as landmen) that gave them the right to explore for and produce minerals that you own; and
- Chesapeake or SandRidge (or their affiliates or agents, such as landmen) paid you a bonus payment in connection with that lease.

Today in History

Today is Friday, Feb. 1, the 32nd day of 2019. There are 333 days left in the year.

Today's Highlight in History:

On Feb. 1, 1960, four black college students began a sit-in protest at a Woolworth's lunch counter in Greensboro, North Carolina, where they'd been refused service.

On this date:

In 1790, the U.S. Supreme Court convened for the first time in New York. (However, since only three of the six justices were present, the court recessed until the next day.)

In 1862, "The Battle Hymn of the Republic," a poem by Julia Ward Howe, was published in the Atlantic Monthly.

In 1942, during World War II, the Voice of America broadcast its first program to Europe, relaying it through the facilities of the British Broadcasting Corp. in London.

In 1943, during World War II, one of America's most highly decorated military units, the 442nd Central Postal Directory, made up almost exclusively of Japanese-Americans, was authorized.

In 1946, Norwegian statesman Trygve Lie (TRIHG'-vuh lee) was chosen to be the first secretary-general of the United Nations.

In 1959, men in Switzerland rejected giving women the right to vote by a more than 2-1 referendum margin. (Swiss women gained the

right to vote in 1971.)

In 1968, during the Vietnam War, South Vietnam's police chief (Nguyen Ngoc Loan) executed a Viet Cong officer with a pistol shot to the head in a scene captured by news photographers. Richard M. Nixon announced his bid for the Republican presidential nomination.

In 1979, Iranian religious leader Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini (hoh-MAY'-nee) received a tumultuous welcome in Tehran as he ended nearly 15 years of exile.

In 1982, "Late Night with David Letterman" premiered on NBC.

In 1993, Gary Bettman took office as the National Hockey League's first commissioner, succeeding the NHL's final president, Gil Stein.

In 1994, Jeff Gillooly, Tonya Harding's ex-husband, pleaded guilty in Portland, Ore., to racketeering for his part in the attack on figure skater Nancy Kerrigan in exchange for a 24-month sentence (he ended up serving six) and a \$100,000 fine.

In 2003, the space shuttle Columbia broke up during re-entry, killing all seven of its crew members: commander Rick Husband; pilot William McCool; payload commander Michael Anderson; mission specialists Kalpana Chawla, David Brown and Laurel Clark; and payload specialist Ilan Ramon (ee-LAHN' rah-MOHN'), the first Israeli in space.

Ten years ago: The Pittsburgh Steelers defeated the Arizona Cardinals 27-23 to win Super Bowl XLIII (43). Rafael Nadal held off Roger Federer to win the Australian Open, 7-5, 3-6, 7-6 (3), 3-6, 6-2. Olympic great Michael Phelps acknowledged "bad judgment" after a photo in a British newspaper showed him inhaling from a marijuana pipe. Australian firefighter Dave Tree was photographed giving water to an injured koala found in burned brushland in Victoria state; the rescued female koala, dubbed "Sam," became an Internet sensation, but ended up being euthanized in Aug. 2009.

Five years ago: The United Nations' secretary-general, Ban Ki-moon, pressed the U.S. and Russia to help ensure that peace talks aimed at stemming Syria's civil war would resume soon after a week of peace talks ended in Geneva with no concrete progress. Ray Guy became the first punter elected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame; joining the long-time Oakland Raider were two first-time eligible players, linebacker Derrick Brooks and offensive tackle Walter Jones, as well as defensive end Michael Strahan, receiver Andre Reed, defensive back Aeneas Williams and defensive end Claude Humphrey. Peyton Manning won his fifth Associated Press NFL Most Valuable Player award in a landslide. Academy Award-winning actor Maximilian Schell, 83, died in Innsbruck, Austria.

One year ago: Republican State Rep. Don Shooter was expelled from the Arizona House because of a lengthy pattern of sexual misconduct, making him the first state lawmaker in the U.S. to be booted out since the #MeToo movement emerged. Sheriff's officials in Los Angeles said new witnesses had emerged in the 1981 drowning death of actress Natalie Wood, prompting investigators to name her former husband, Robert Wagner, a "person of interest" in what they considered a "suspicious death." (Detectives later said the evidence hadn't reached the threshold for a murder investigation and that they had no plans to file criminal charges.) A

Trump to call for unity, face skepticism

President will give State of the Union address in midst of rampant partisanship

WASHINGTON — The White House says President Donald Trump will call for optimism and unity in Tuesday’s State of the Union address, using the moment to attempt a reset after two years of bitter partisanship and deeply personal attacks.

But will anyone buy it?

Skepticism will emanate from both sides of the aisle when Trump enters the House chamber for the primetime address to lawmakers and the nation. Democrats, emboldened after the midterm elections and the recent shutdown fight, see little evidence of a president willing to compromise. And even the president’s staunchest allies know that bipartisan rhetoric read off a teleprompter is usually undermined by scorching tweets and unpredictable policy maneuvers.

Still, the fact that Trump’s advisers feel a need to try a different approach is a tacit acknowledgement that the president’s standing is weakened as he begins his third year in office.

The shutdown left some Republicans frustrated over his insistence on a border wall, something they warned him the new Democratic House majority would not bend on. Trump’s

approval rating during the shutdown dipped to 34 percent, down from 42 percent a month earlier, according to a recent survey conducted by The Associated Press-NORC Center for Public Affairs Research.

White House counselor Kellyanne Conway said the president would use his address “to call for an end to the politics of resistance, retribution.”

“He’s calling for cooperation,” she said, adding that Trump will point to examples of where this has happened on his watch. Officials said the president is also expected to highlight infrastructure, trade and prescription drug pricing as areas in which the parties could work together.

But Washington’s most recent debate offered few signs of cooperation between Trump and Democrats. Under pressure from conservative backers, Trump refused to

sign a government funding bill that did not include money for his long-sought border wall. With hundreds of thousands of Americans missing paychecks, Trump ultimately agreed to reopen the government for three weeks to allow negotiations on border security to continue.

With the new Feb. 15 funding deadline looming, Trump is expected to use his address to outline his demands, which still include funding for a wall along the U.S.-Mexico border. He’s teased the possibility of declaring a national emergency to secure wall funding if Congress doesn’t act, though it appeared unlikely he would take that step Tuesday night. Advisers have also been reviewing options to secure some funding without making such a declaration.

“You’ll hear the State of the Union, and then you’ll

see what happens right after the State of the Union,” Trump told reporters.

The president’s address marks the first time he is speaking before a Congress that is not fully under Republican control. House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, who won plaudits from Democrats for her hard-line negotiating tactics during the shutdown, will be seated behind the president — a visual reminder of Trump’s political opposition.

In the audience will be several Democrats running to challenge Trump in 2020, including Sens. Kamala Harris of California, Cory Booker of New Jersey, Elizabeth Warren of Massachusetts and Kirsten Gillibrand of New York.

Another Democratic star, Stacey Abrams, will deliver the party’s response to Trump. Abrams narrowly lost her bid in November to become Georgia’s first black governor, and party leaders are aggressively recruiting her to run for Senate.

While White House officials cautioned that Trump’s remarks were still being finalized, the president was expected to use some of his televised address to showcase a growing economy. Despite the shutdown, the U.S. economy added a robust 304,000 jobs in January, marking 100 straight months of job growth. That’s the longest such period on record.

LEAVENWORTH — Prosecutors are researching an appeal after a Kansas judge called two teenage girls the “aggressor” in a sexual encounter with a 67-year-old man and eased his prison sentence.

Leavenworth County District Judge Michael Gibbens sentenced Raymond Soden in December to five years, 10 months in prison for soliciting a 13-year-old on Facebook. Prosecutors had sought more than 13 years behind bars because Soden had prior convictions, the Kansas City Star reported.

Soden admitted in his plea to knowing that one of the young girls was 13 when he began exchanging messages with her online.

But Gibbens said that the girls, ages 13 and 14, were “more an aggressor than a participant.”

He cited that the teens had voluntarily gone to Soden’s house and taken money for sexual favors as reasons for his decision to give Soden a prison sentence that’s eight years less than what’s called for in Kansas sentencing guidelines. Gibbens also questioned the level of harm the victims suffered because they didn’t appear at the sentencing hearing.

Gibbens declined the newspaper’s request for

comment.

Leavenworth County Attorney Todd Thompson said prosecutors are researching a possible appeal but haven’t made a decision yet.

Harleigh Harrold, a prevention coordinator for the Metropolitan Organization to Counter Sexual Assault, told the newspaper that

children don’t have the ability to understand the consequences of such an act.

She said perpetrators target children from troubled situations that may lack the support they need.

“It doesn’t mean those children are at fault in any way or have to opportunity to consent in a relationship

with an adult,” Harrold said.

Michelle Herman, president and CEO of the child advocacy center Sunflower House, said “sexual assault is never the victim’s fault.”

“It doesn’t matter what the girls did or didn’t do, he is still the adult and nobody deserves to be taken advantage of sexually,” Herman said.

US ANNOUNCES PULLOUT FROM KEY ARMS TREATY WITH RUSSIA

WASHINGTON — The Trump administration said Friday it is withdrawing from a treaty that has been a centerpiece of superpower arms control since the Cold War. Some analysts worry the move could fuel a new arms race.

President Donald Trump said in a statement that Russia, “for far too long,” has violated the Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces treaty “with impunity, covertly developing and fielding a prohibited missile system that poses a direct threat to our allies and troops abroad.”

He said the U.S. “has fully adhered” to the pact for

more than 30 years, “but we will not remain constrained by its terms while Russia misrepresents its actions. We cannot be the only country in the world unilaterally bound by this treaty, or any other.”

NATO said that if Moscow failed to destroy all new missile systems that Washington insists violate the treaty, “Russia will bear sole responsibility for the end of the treaty.”

An American withdrawal had been expected for months, after years of unresolved dispute over Russian compliance with the pact. It was the first arms control measure to ban an entire class of weapons: ground-launched cruise missiles

with a range between 310 miles and 3,400 miles. Russia denies that it has been in violation.

U.S. officials also have expressed worry that China, which is not party to the 1987 treaty, is gaining a significant military advantage in Asia by deploying large numbers of missiles with ranges beyond the treaty's limit. Leaving the INF treaty would allow the Trump administration to counter the Chinese, but it's unclear how it would do that.

Secretary of State Mike Pompeo said in early December that Washington would give Moscow 60 days to return to compliance before it gave formal notice of withdrawal, with actual

withdrawal taking place six months later. The 60-day deadline expires on Saturday, and the administration is expected to say as early as Friday that efforts to work out a compliance deal have failed and that it would suspend its compliance with the treaty's terms.

Technically, a U.S. withdrawal would take effect six months after this week's notification, leaving a small window for saving the treaty. However, in talks this week in Beijing, the U.S. and Russia reported no breakthrough in their dispute, leaving little reason to think either side would change its stance on whether a Russian cruise missile violates the pact.

A Russian deputy foreign minister, Sergei Ryabkov, was quoted by the Russian state news agency Tass as saying after the Beijing talks Thursday, “Unfortunately, there is no progress. The position of the American side is very tough and like an ultimatum.” He said he expects Washington now to suspend its obligations under the treaty, although he added that Moscow remains ready to “search for solutions” that could keep the treaty in force.

U.S. withdrawal raises the prospect of further deterioration in U.S.-Russian relations, which already are arguably at the lowest point in decades, and debate among U.S. allies in Europe over whether Rus-

sia's alleged violations warrant a countermeasure such as deployment of an equivalent American missile in Europe. The U.S. has no nuclear-capable missiles based in Europe; the last of that type and range were withdrawn in line with the INF treaty.

Nuclear weapons experts at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace said in a statement this week that while Russia's violation of the INF treaty is a serious problem, U.S. withdrawal under current circumstances would be counterproductive.

“Leaving the INF treaty will unleash a new missile competition between the United States and Russia,” they said.

US EMPLOYERS ADD ROBUST 304K JOBS; JOBLESSNESS UP TO 4 PCT.

WASHINGTON — U.S. employers shrugged off last month's partial government shutdown and engaged in a burst of hiring in January, adding 304,000 jobs, the most in nearly a year.

The healthy gain the government reported Friday illustrated the job market's durability nearly a decade into the economic expansion. The U.S. has now added jobs for 100 straight months, the longest such period on record.

The unemployment rate did rise in January to 4 percent from 3.9 percent, but mostly for a technical reason: Roughly 175,000 federal workers were counted as temporarily unemployed last month because of the shutdown.

The government on Friday also sharply revised down its estimate of job growth in December, to 222,000 from a previously estimated 312,000. Still, hiring has accelerated since last summer, a development that has surprised economists because hiring typically slows when unemployment is so low.

The ongoing demand for workers is leading some businesses to offer higher pay to attract and keep staff. Average hourly wages rose 3.2 percent in January from a year earlier. That's just below the annual gain of 3.3 percent in December, which matched October and November for the fastest increase since April 2009.

The strong job market is also encouraging more people who weren't working to begin looking. The proportion of Americans who either have a job or are seeking one — which had been unusually low since the recession ended a decade ago — reached 63.2 percent in January, the highest level in more than five years.

The 35-day government shutdown caused 800,000 workers to miss two paychecks. But because these workers will eventually receive back pay, they were counted as employed in the survey of businesses that produces the monthly job gain.

But in a separate survey of households that's used to calculate the unemployment rate, many of these people were counted as temporarily jobless. That's a key reason why the unemployment rate rose despite the healthy job gain.

Most economists have forecast that the shutdown will likely slow economic growth for the first three months of this year. But some say that even businesses that lost income from the shutdown likely held onto their staffs, knowing that the shutdown would only be temporary.

Friday's solid jobs report

provided a dose of reassurance that the economy remains mostly healthy and likely to shake off any effects of the shutdown. The nonpartisan Congressional Budget Office estimates that the shutdown slowed annual growth for the January-March quarter by about 0.4 percentage point, to a rate of 2.1 percent, though that loss should lead to a bounce-back later this year.

The main reason for the temporary economic loss this quarter is that the thousands of government workers who missed two paychecks slowed their spending. The government itself also spent less. In addition, many businesses across the country lost income. Tourists cut back on visits to national parks, for example, thereby hurting nearby restaurants and hotels.

Yet with unemployment so low and many companies struggling to fill jobs, layoffs might not have been widespread.

The partial government shutdown has delayed the release of a range of government data about the economy, including statistics on housing, factory orders, and fourth-quarter growth.

The reports that have been released have been mixed. The Federal Reserve's industrial production report showed that manufacturing output rose in December by the most in nearly a year, boosted by auto production.

But consumer confidence fell in January for a third straight month as Americans' optimism dimmed amid the shutdown and sharp drops in the stock market.

Falling confidence can cause consumers to restrain their spending, though economists note that confidence typically returns quickly after shutdowns end.

The housing market has slumped as mortgage rates have increased. Sales of existing homes plunged in December and fell 3.1 percent in 2018 from the previous year. Mortgage rates have fallen back after nearly touching 5 percent last year, but the number of Americans who signed contracts to buy homes still declined in December.

China's economy is decelerating sharply, the United Kingdom is struggling to negotiate its exit from the European Union, and Italy's economy has entered recession, exacerbating fears that slower global growth will cut into U.S. exports.

Fed Chairman Jerome Powell this week cited the weaker global economy as a key reason why the central bank will be “patient” before it raises its benchmark interest rate again. That was a sharp turnaround from January, when Fed policymakers forecast two additional hikes for this year.

DAKAR, SENEGAL — The deadly Ebola outbreak in eastern Congo marked six months on Friday with officials noting a worrying number of confirmed cases linked to health centers.

Such infections are seen as a major problem that highlights poor practices and the risk of spread among patients and workers. Combined with community resistance in an unstable, densely populated region that has never faced Ebola before, the task of containing the outbreak remains challenging.

In the current epicenter, the communities of Butembo and Katwa, 86 percent of Ebola cases since Dec. 1 “had visited or worked in a health care facility before or after their onset of illness,” the World Health Organization said.

In the past three weeks in Katwa, 49 “health structures” were identified where confirmed cases were hospitalized, and eight new infected health workers were reported, WHO said.

With 759 Ebola cases,

including 705 of them confirmed and 414 confirmed deaths, this has become the second-largest Ebola outbreak in history, behind the West Africa outbreak that killed more than 11,000 in 2014-2016.

No end is in sight.

“This is a particularly complex area with such insecurity,” Dr. Ibrahima Soce Fall, the WHO regional director for emergencies, told The Associated Press. “We have been able to control many hotspots, but it will take some time to really end the outbreak.”

Katwa is the latest community to present officials with a population that is wary of outsiders after years of rebel attacks in the region.

“They don't trust authorities in Congo because they've been exposed to insecurity and conflict for more than 20 years,” Fall said. “You cannot control this type of outbreak without having the community involved for rapid detection.” In Beni, an early epicenter, it took months before some communities showed trust, he said.

People often still choose

to go to traditional health centers instead of hospitals.

“Many people have gotten infected in those facilities. If you have malaria, you may be in the same place as someone with Ebola,” Fall said. “They don't have doctors there, and the people working aren't qualified.”

There is a Settlement with Chesapeake Energy Corp., Chesapeake Exploration, L.L.C., Tom L. Ward, and their affiliates (collectively, "Chesapeake") in a class action lawsuit about price-fixing and settling low bonus prices paid to landowners in exchange for the right to explore for and produce minerals on the land. The lawsuit claims that Chesapeake and SandRidge Energy, Inc. and SandRidge Exploration and Production, L.L.C. ("SandRidge") unlawfully conspired to fix, raise, maintain or stabilize lease bonuses in the Mississippi Lime Play of the Anadarko Basin Region, to reduce bonus payments to the landowners.

The litigation claims that Chesapeake and Sandridge conspired to fix or set low bonus prices paid to the landowners in exchange for the chance to lease the leasehold or working interests. Instead of competing against each other to offer the landowners the highest bid or bonus price for leasing the land, Chesapeake and SandRidge conspired to provide a low bonus to the landowners. As a result, the landowners did not receive as high of a bonus payment for leasing their minerals to Chesapeake and SandRidge as they should have received. Chesapeake and SandRidge deny these claims and maintain they did nothing wrong. Plaintiffs in this lawsuit have brought an antitrust claim under the Sherman Act against Defendants.

Am I included? You are included in the Settlement if you (individual or entity):

- Owned land within the Mississippi Lime Play (see below for definition);
- And at any time between December 27, 2007 and April 1, 2013;
- You signed a lease with Chesapeake or SandRidge (or their affiliates or agents, such as landmen) that gave them the right to explore for and produce minerals that you own; and
- Chesapeake or SandRidge (or their affiliates or agents, such as landmen) paid you a bonus payment in connection with that lease.

Police also recovered blood which matched Allen’s from a pair of flip-flops or “slider” shoes abandoned in the street near the crime scene that were identified as Moore’s, though there was insufficient DNA to say he wore them.

Investigators also found blood spots on a shirt and pants Moore admitted to abandoning, though again they couldn’t be positively matched through DNA.

Moore’s appointed defense argued that the case against Moore was circumstantial and that police did not investigate the people who identified Moore as the killer, particularly Allen’s common-law wife and her brother, who told several conflicting stories to police.

“He denied a minimum

of 40 times that he had anything to do with the murder,” said attorney Christine Jones said, referring to the police interview. Near the end of the interview, “after he was fed the details (of the homicide) he parroted them back to the officer.”

Allen’s wife, Jessica Crowe, testified she believed Allen was molesting her children, but that police didn’t believe her. Crowe, who admitted to being schizophrenic and regularly using methamphetamine, was showing around a photo on her cell phone the night of the killing she believed was Allen’s exposed penis in front of her children, and was very upset about it.

Then she returned home, where Allen was watching a pornographic movie in bed and wanting her to join him. She put him off.

Jones pointed to a bleach bottle in a crime scene photo on the floor of the bathroom in the home

where Allen died, and to the fact Crowe insisted Moore use bleach to wash his hands at her mother’s house to remove any gunshot residue. Yet, police did not search either bathroom for blood, Jones said.

She also questioned the timeline of events outlined by both Crowe and her brother, noting there were hours unaccounted for between the slaying and when Crowe’s mother called the police.

“Jessica told the police ‘he did it,’ and from that moment on police had the suspect and didn’t look any further,” Jones said. “In the end, we’re left with blood on slides anyone could have had on when they shot a sleeping man.”

“There’s a lot of blood on the left slide, found conveniently abandoned in the street at the crime scene, but there’s no blood on the socks Q (Moore) was wearing,” Jones said. “Look at the slide. It doesn’t cover much. The foot on the left

side should have been covered in blood. It’s on the strap; it’s on the footbed. Anyone could wear it. It’s a slide. Anyone could put it on.”

The defense rested Thursday morning after calling only one witness. Hutchinson Police Detective Jessica Kelly, who was called to introduce color photographs from the crime scene showing a pool of blood and blood spatters on the wall and doorframe.

Kelly had created a diagram of the house, which included measuring where the spatters were from the floor. The one on the wall was 5-feet, 6-inches from the floor, while the spatter on the doorframe was at 4-foot, 3-inches. There was also a large pool of blood.

Reno County District Attorney then recalled Reno County Death Investigator John Tracy as a rebuttal witness, but Reno County District Judge Tim

Chambers found Schroeder failed to qualify Tracy as an expert on blood spatters and wouldn’t allow him to answer questions about the blood.

In the end, the defense never explained what they intended to show with the photos.

Correction records show Moore has 2002 convictions out of Finney County for criminal discharge of a firearm into an occupied vehicle and two counts of criminal damage to property. He also has a 2016 conviction out of Rice County for burglary of a dwelling.

Man found with wife’s dismembered body convicted of felonies

Investigators allege Rey took photographs with his wife’s body and his newborn and 2-year-old, then dismembered the body two days later in a hotel bathtub and put some of the remains in a large cooler.

OLATHE — A man arrested at a Kansas storage unit with two of his children and his dismembered wife’s remains has been convicted of three felony counts of sexual exploitation of a child.

Jurors Thursday found 36-year-old Justin Rey guilty of the felonies, as well as misdemeanor counts of child endangerment and contributing to a child’s misconduct, prosecutor’s spokeswoman Kristi Bergeron said. Authorities say child porn — in Kansas, possessing such material constitutes sexual exploitation of a child — was found after Rey asked them to look at his phone for evidence he thought would help him at trial.

He hasn’t been charged in the death of his wife, Jessica Monteiro Rey, who died after giving birth in October 2017 in a bathtub at a Kansas City, Missouri, hotel room. Rey told law enforcement both that she killed herself and that she died of childbirth complications. The coroner who performed the autopsy couldn’t determine her cause of death.

Rey testified at trial, but his attorney only asked

questions about the child pornography, which prevented prosecutors from questioning him about the children and what happened to his wife.

But in a series of phone interviews with The Associated Press, Rey said he didn’t call police because he didn’t want them to “steal more children.” He said he and his wife had six children together and that police had “stolen our children before.”

Investigators allege Rey took photographs with his wife’s body and his newborn and 2-year-old, then dismembered the body two days later in a hotel bathtub and put some of the remains in a large cooler. Police said that he flushed some parts that wouldn’t fit down the toilet. Surveillance video footage showed him pulling a red cooler with a black bag on top of it through the hotel, while pushing a stroller with a toddler walking beside him. Asked about her dismemberment, Rey told the AP, “What was I supposed to do? I wasn’t going to

leave mama behind.”

He was arrested with the two children at a storage unit in nearby Lenexa, Kansas, where he said he was making preparations to take his wife’s remains to Arizona for a religious ceremony on a Native American reservation.

Rey also is charged with abandonment of a corpse in Missouri and with murder in the death of Sean Ty Ferel, a Palm Springs, California, man.

Investigators in California say Ferel disappeared after vacationing with Rey in 2016. Ferel’s body hasn’t been found, but his blood was detected in the trunk of his vehicle after Rey was involved in an accident with it months after Ferel disappeared. Rey told the AP that Ferel died of natural causes and that he burned him in Arizona in the same type of religious ceremony he planned for his wife.

Sentencing for Rey in the Kansas case is set for March 27. Bergen says the potential sentence won’t be known until the pre-sentence investigation is completed.

Man sentenced to 71 years in prison for rape

A 33-year-old Haysville man with a long record of criminal offenses has been sentenced to 71 years in prison for raping a 68-year-old woman.

Garon Spencer was sentenced Wednesday for rape, aggravated criminal sodomy and aggravated sexual battery.

Prosecutors say Spencer attacked the woman in her home on Nov. 10, 2017.

The Sedgwick County District Attorney said in a news release that during sentencing, the judge noted Spencer’s criminal history included a juvenile conviction of aggravated criminal sodomy, and adult charges of aggravated assault, criminal threat and misdemeanor sexual battery.

Being a quiet rancher is John Bauder's favored life

The prairies might just be a celebration of the quiet life which John Bauder of rural Howard enjoys every day.

A native of Elk County, he graduated from Howard High School then spent several years living elsewhere, and even trained for a time to become a nurse. But when his father needed help on the farm at home in Elk County, he felt the nudge in 1982 toward returning to rural life.

He enjoys taking care of his cow/calf operation on a ranch that sprawls in several directions from his homestead located between Moline and Howard. Like all ranchers, he spends a good part of each day feeding his cattle.

But his eye is always on the pests that occupy unwanted space in his pastures — sericia lespedeza, sumac, cedars and all the others.

While he does some spraying himself, he calls in aerial sprayers to apply chemicals to larger pastures. He tries not to overdo the spraying for sericia, because it also takes out hedge trees that he likes to keep in certain areas. And, he burns on a seasonal schedule.

John Bauder works by himself, until it comes hay season when he teams up with several neighboring farmers to share

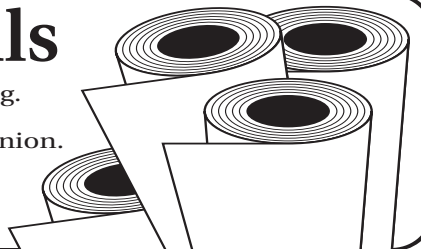

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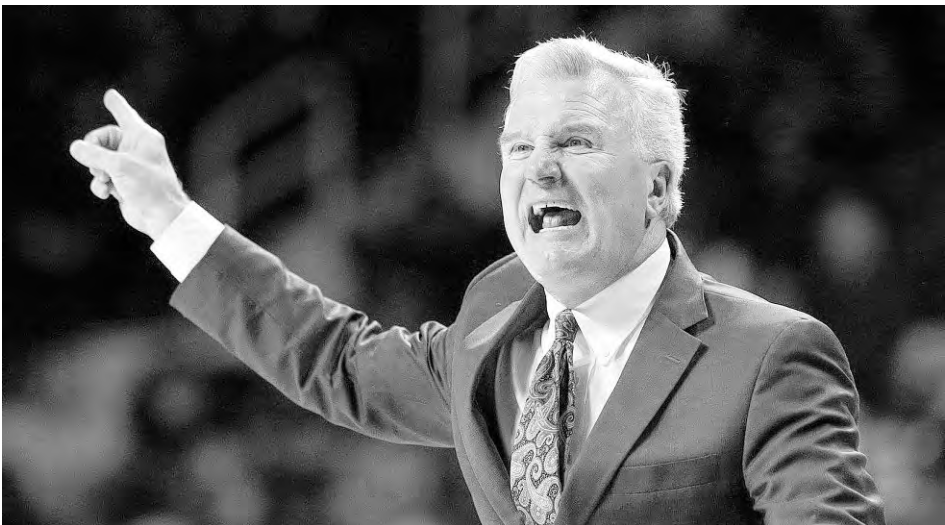

K-STATE Q&A

Answering your questions about the basketball team

It's time for a special Wednesday edition of K-State Q&A.

No need for a lengthy introduction this week. We've got lots of great topics, so let's dive right in. Thanks, as always, for your participation.

Q: Why is the K-State BB

team so inconsistent? Its worst losses have been against unranked teams. For instance, last Saturday's game should've been won. - @vhernandezdmd

A: Here's the thing about K-State basketball when it comes to consistency: You never know what you're going to get on offense from the vast majority of the roster.

Barry Brown and Dean Wade are usually going to provide 10-25 points, and Kamau Stokes is usually going to give you 8-15

points. But it's a mystery after that.

No one else on the team has a high floor. Xavier Sneed, Makol Mawien, Cartier Diarra, Mike McGuirl and anyone else Bruce Weber inserts into games is just as likely to go scoreless as he is to score 15 points.

When those players have good games, K-State tends to win. When they disappear, K-State tends to lose.

Diarra had 14 points against Texas A&M, but

everyone else in that group might as well have stayed home. Sneed (2), Mawien (0), McGuirl (1) and the rest of the team combined for three points.

Fans can count on K-State to play great defense. But every game is a mystery on offense, especially when the opponent goes with a zone defense. That leads to inconsistent results.

When things line up for the Wildcats, they can win five Big 12 games in a row. When the opposite occurs, they can lose to just about anyone. This team face plants every month or so with an unsightly defeat. Odds are good it will happen again, unless K-State can establish more consistent scoring threats.

Q: Is the A&M loss worse than the Tulsa loss? - @KStateDom

A: That's a depressing question right there. But you asked, so I will answer.

Both losses were pretty darn bad. On paper, I suppose Tulsa was a little worse. The Hurricane are 2-6 in the American and rank 140th in KenPom. Texas A&M is a little better at No. 122, but the Aggies have a worse conference record at 1-5 in the SEC. So you could make an argument, either way.

Let's make the case for both.

Tulsa: The Hurricane defeated K-State last season in Wichita by deploying a zone defense. The Wildcats scored 54 points

and should have been ready to get some revenge in Tulsa. But things didn't work out that way. Frank Haith stymied K-State with the exact same approach and beat the Wildcats 47-46. Dean Wade (two), Barry Brown (six) and Kamau Stokes (four) combined for 12 points on 30 shots. How in the world does that happen?

Texas A&M: Very few people in College Station, Texas care about basketball and very few people showed up to support Texas A&M in this game. It was a dead environment. The Aggies were struggling so mightily that coach Billy Kennedy turned to walk-ons in the first half and were ripe for a whooping. But K-State failed to bury them when it had the chance in the first half and Wendell Mitchell caught fire in the second half. Once again, the Wildcats had no answer for a zone defense. Makol Mawien and the four reserve big men Weber played behind him all went scoreless.

Yeah, I'm going with Tulsa. The Wildcats should have been up for that game and flopped hard. At least with Texas A&M you could argue the team overlooked a middling opponent in the Big 12/SEC Challenge.

Q: What happened @ A&M? Which K-State team will show up @ OSU on Saturday? - @PvillePastor

A: You're kidding yourself if you think you know

what will happen in K-State's next game at Oklahoma State or in any game after that.

The Wildcats' next five games are at Oklahoma State, vs. Kansas, at Baylor, at Texas, vs. Iowa State. They are all coin flips. You could sell me on anything from 5-0 to 0-5.

Q: But I'm guessing it will be 2-3 or 3-2.

A: This team is inconsistent. And Big 12 basketball has devolved into a game of Super Smash Bros. with eight players crammed into a tiny level. Just when you think a favorite might be ready to emerge, Jigglypuff grabs a hammer and sends three competitors off the screen. That sounds a bit like some of the recent scores. Who expected Baylor and K-State to be leading the race in late January?

Chief Judge Joe Heaton of the United States District Court for the Western District of Oklahoma is overseeing this case. This litigation has been consolidated within *In re Anadarko Basin Oil and Gas Lease Antitrust Litigation*, Case No. 16-cv-209-HE.

2. What is this lawsuit about?

Chesapeake, SandRidge, and Mr. Ward were sued by mineral owners (Plaintiffs) in federal court for conspiring to fix or set prices paid to them in exchange for the chance to lease the leasehold or working interests. Plaintiffs alleged that instead of competing against each other to offer the leaseholders the highest price for leasing the mineral interest, Chesapeake and SandRidge conspired to provide a low price to the leaseholders. As a result, the leaseholders did not receive as high of a payment for leasing their minerals or working interests to Chesapeake and SandRidge as they should have received. Chesapeake and SandRidge deny these claims and maintain they did nothing wrong. Plaintiffs in this lawsuit have brought an antitrust claim under the Sherman Act against Defendants.

3. Are there any related lawsuits?

Yes. In addition to all lawsuits consolidated in this litigation, there are two lawsuits originally filed in Oklahoma state court alleging violations of state law that also are included in the Settlement Class: *Koppitz v. Chesapeake Energy Corporation et al.* (Case No. CJ-16-26, Woods Co.) and *Mallory v. Chesapeake Energy Corp. et al.* (Case No. CJ-16-63R, Stephens Co.). This Settlement Class includes the Plaintiffs in these lawsuits.

4. Why is this a class action?

In a class action, one or more people called “Class Representatives” sue on behalf of themselves and other people with similar claims. All of these people together are the “class” or “class members.” In this Settlement, the Class Representatives are: Edward Clark, Inc., Curtis Crandall, Amy Herzog, Mahony-Killian, Inc., Ida Powers, and Brian Thieme. One court resolves the issues for all Class Members, except for those who exclude themselves from the Class.

5. Why is there a Settlement?

The Court has not decided in favor of the Plaintiffs or Defendants. Instead, the Parties have engaged in lengthy negotiations, and Plaintiffs and Defendants have agreed to a Settlement. By agreeing to settle, the Parties avoid the costs and uncertainty of a trial, and the people affected will get a chance to receive compensation. The Class Plaintiffs and their attorneys think the Settlement is best for all Class Members. The proposed Settlement does not mean that any law was broken or that Defendants did anything wrong.

WHO IS IN THE SETTLEMENT?

Unless you exclude yourself from the Settlement, you will give up your right to sue any of the Defendants or SandRidge for the claims being resolved by this Settlement. The specific claims you are giving up against Defendants and all related parties are described in Paragraph 23 of the Settlement Agreement. You will be "releasing" Chesapeake, SandRidge, Mr. Ward, and all related people as described in the Settlement Agreement.

The released claims do not, however, include the following:

- Claims arising in the ordinary course of business relating to, for example, breach of contract, personal injury, property damage or diminution in property value;
- Claims to enforce any of the terms of the Settlement Agreement in this case; or
- Claims that do not arise out of the factual predicate of this Class Action.

The Settlement Agreement available at www.anadarkosettlement.com describes the released claims with specific descriptions, so read it carefully. If you have any questions, you can talk to the law firms listed in Question 19 for free or you can, of course, talk to your own lawyer about what this means.

HOW TO RECEIVE A PAYMENT

13. How can I receive a payment?

You will need to complete and submit a Proof of Claim by June 24, 2019. Claims may be submitted online at www.anadarkosettlement.com. If you submit a Proof of Claim with your contact information, you will receive future notifications containing additional important information, including with respect to any future Settlements. 14. What if my claim is rejected?

The Settlement provides a process for Class Members to contest the rejection of a claim. You will get further details in the letter you receive after your claim has been processed. If your claim is rejected, you may request a review. You will need to do so in writing and submit reasons for why you are contesting the rejection along with any supporting documentation. If your dispute cannot be

resolved, it may be presented to the Court for review. The Court's decision will be final and binding. More details are in a document called the Settlement Agreement, which is available at www.anadarkosettlement.com

EXCLUDING YOURSELF FROM THE SETTLEMENT

If you don't want a payment/benefits from this Settlement, and you want to keep the right to sue Defendants about the issues in this case, then you must take steps to get out of the Settlement. This is called excluding yourself—or it is sometimes referred to as “opting out” of the Class.

15. How do I get out of the Settlement?

To exclude yourself from the Settlement, you must mail a letter or other written document to the Settlement Administrator. To exclude yourself from the Class, you must file a timely written request for exclusion (“Request for Exclusion”).

A Request for Exclusion must:

- Be in writing;
- Be signed by you or your authorized representative;
- State your name, address, and telephone number;
- Include proof of membership in the Class by identifying the leased property in which you claim to own an interest and/or documentation evidencing you sold or transferred your leasehold or working interest to Chesapeake or SandRidge during the Class Period (December 27, 2007 through April 1, 2013);
- Include a signed statement that “I/we hereby request that I/we be excluded from the proposed Class in the *In re Anadarko Basin Oil & Gas Antitrust Litigation*, Case No. 16-cv-209-HE in the United States District Court for the Western District of Oklahoma”;
- Be mailed to the Clerk of the Court at the address provided below and postmarked no later than **April 4, 2019**.

You must also provide any other information reasonably requested by the Claims Administrator. You must mail your Request for Exclusion, postmarked no later than **April 4, 2019** to:

16. If I do not exclude myself, can I sue Defendants for the same thing later?

No. Unless you exclude yourself, you give up the right to sue Chesapeake, SandRidge, and Mr. Ward for the claims that you release through this Settlement.

17. If I exclude myself, can I still get a payment from this Settlement?

No. You will not get a payment if you exclude yourself from this Settlement.

THE LAWYERS REPRESENTING YOU

18. Do I have a lawyer in the case?

The Court has appointed four law firms to represent all Class Members as interim “Class Counsel.” They can be contacted at:

You will not be charged for contacting these lawyers. If you want to be represented by your own lawyer, you may hire one at your own expense.

19. How will the lawyers be paid?

Class Counsel will ask the Court for attorneys' fees up to one-third of the \$6.95 million Settlement Fund as well as reimbursement for costs and expenses. The fees and expenses awarded by the Court will be paid out of the Settlement Fund. The Court will decide the amount of fees to award. Class Counsel will also request that special service payments of up to \$10,000 each be paid from the Settlement Fund to the Class Representatives for their service as representatives on behalf of the whole Class.

OBJECTING TO THE SETTLEMENT**20. How do I tell the Court if I do not like the Settlement?**

If you are a member of the Class, you can object to the Settlement if you don't like some part of it. To object, you must submit a letter or other written document that includes the following:

- Your name, current address, and telephone number;
- A statement saying that you object to the Settlement in *In re Anadarko Basin Oil & Gas Antitrust Litigation*, Case No. 16-cv-209-HE in the United States District Court for the Western District of Oklahoma;
- Whether you plan to appear at the Final Fairness Hearing in person or through counsel, and include counsel's name, address, and telephone number (*see* Question 23);
- Proof of membership in the Class, including identifying the leased property in which you claim you own an interest, and/or documentation evidencing you sold or transferred your leasehold or working interest to Chesapeake or SandRidge during the Class Period (December 27, 2007 through April 1, 2013);
- The specific legal and factual bases as to why you object to the Settlement, along with any supporting materials or documents that you want the Court to consider; and
- Your signature.

The objection must be delivered or sent for filing to the Clerk of the Court, by mail or special delivery service to the address listed below with a postmark no later than **April 4, 2019**.

If your objection is not postmarked by the deadline and does not include the information listed above, it will not be valid.

21. What is the difference between objecting and asking to be excluded?

Objecting is simply telling the Court that you don't like something about the Settlement. You can object only if you don't exclude yourself from the Class. Excluding yourself is telling the Court that you don't want to be part of the Class. If you exclude yourself, you have no basis to object because the Settlement no longer affects you. If you choose to exclude yourself or object to the Settlement, Court filings of exclusions and objections will publicly reveal your identity.

THE FINAL FAIRNESS HEARING

The Court will hold a hearing to decide whether to approve the Settlement and any requests for fees and expenses. You may attend, and you may ask to speak, but you do not have to.

22. When and where will the Court decide whether to approve the Settlement?

The Court will hold a Final Fairness Hearing at 9:30 a.m. on **April 25, 2019**, at the William J. Holloway United States Courthouse, Western District of Oklahoma, 200 NW 4th Street, Oklahoma City, OK 73102, Courtroom 301. The hearing may be moved to a different location or time without additional notice, so it is a good idea to check www.anadarkosettlement.com or call 1-844-833-3816. At this hearing, the Court will consider whether the Settlement, Plan of Allocation, and any proposed fees and expenses are fair, reasonable, and adequate. If there are objections, the Court will consider them and will listen to people who have asked to speak at the hearing. The Court may also decide how much to pay Class Counsel. After the hearing, the Court will decide whether to approve the Settlement. We do not know how long these decisions will take.

23. Do I have to attend the hearing?

No. Class Counsel will answer questions the Court may have. But, you or your own lawyer are welcome to attend at your expense. If you send an objection, you do not have to come to Court to talk about it. As long as you mailed your written objection on time, the Court will consider it. You may also have your own lawyer attend, but it is not necessary.

24. May I speak at the hearing?

You may ask the Court for permission to speak at the Final Fairness Hearing. To speak at the Final Fairness Hearing, you must send a letter or other written document saying that the letter or document is your "Notice of Intention to Appear" in *In re Anadarko Basin Oil & Gas Antitrust Litigation*, Case No. 16-cv-209-HE. Be sure to include your name, address, telephone number, and your signature. You must send your "Notice of Intention to Appear" to the addresses listed in Question 20, so it is postmarked no later than **April 11, 2019**.
